FUNERAL LITURGY

The Celebration of the life of your Loved One expresses our faith in Christ's victory over death. We express that faith through rituals and symbols, songs and Scripture readings, prayers and meditation.

CHURCH ARRANGEMENTS

The Funeral Liturgy arrangements should be made with St. Veronica Parish by an immediate family member of the deceased ONLY, AND NOT THE FUNERAL HOME. Please contact St. Veronica Parish Office at (708) 799-5400. Please do not assume that the Church and the presider are available until you confirm it personally with the Parish Secretary. During non-business hours, please call the main parish office phone number and press 9. Please note that the Funeral Home will handle the Funeral Offering with the parish on your behalf.

The Funeral Mass offering includes the fees for the Church, St. Veronica Accompanist and Cantor. The offerings for extra musicians who are not employees of the parish such as flautists, violinists, guitarists, etc. is in addition to the Set Offering and will vary depending on selections. Musicians have their own fees that are set by them and not the Parish.



MUSIC

Please arrange the Liturgy at the Parish Office. The music will be led by St. Veronica's Music Coordinator, Mr. Justin DeAngelo. The list of songs for the Funeral Mass is listed on page 8. Please select the songs for: Gathering, Presentation of the Gifts, Communion and the Conclusion of the Eucharist (Recessional Song).

You may choose to request a St. Veronica Cantor or a Cantor along with the Resurrection Funeral Choir formed by St. Veronica's Parishioners. If you would like other musicians to be involved, they would need to have experience working in the Catholic Church and be approved by St. Veronica's Pastor. However, outside musicians would not be able to lead the music but, instead, supplement St. Veronica's musicians. It is our policy that the leading musicians are the musicians of St. Veronica Parish. No exceptions can be made to this policy.

ARRIVAL FOR THE MASS / WAKE

Due to other liturgies scheduled in our church, we ask that you arrive not earlier than 10 MINUTES before. Also, we ask the Funeral Home to make sure that we begin the Liturgy without any delays.

WAKE

A Wake can be scheduled <u>ONE HOUR</u> before the Funeral Mass from 10 AM to 11 AM. Please make sure that you DO NOT ARRIVE EARLIER THAN 10 MINUTES BEFORE THE SCHEDULED TIME. The service will be held in the Church. Food, drink and recorded music are not allowed.

FUNERAL MASS or FUNERAL SERVICE

The Funeral Mass will last approximately one hour. It will include the Welcoming of the Body or Ashes, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, Communion Rite and Final Commendation.

We encourage you to celebrate the life of your Loved One at Mass. However, sometimes we are being asked to make the celebration brief or exclude the Liturgy of the Eucharist. In such situations, we advise that a Funeral Service should be arranged at the Funeral Home instead. One of our Priests or Deacons will be honored to celebrate your Loved One's life



with you and your family at the Funeral Home. The Funeral Service will last approximately twenty minutes and will include Liturgy of the Word and Final Commendation.

If the Liturgy is scheduled after the burial, the Memorial Mass will include Gathering, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, Communion Rite and Concluding Rite.

EULOGY AT MASS

The reflection is to be given by one person who represents the family of the deceased. It is the Policy of the Archdiocese of Chicago that there is only ONE eulogy. The reflection needs to be written down and be NO LONGER THAN 3 MINUTES in length. There might be another funeral or other events scheduled in the Church and we would not want to make the Liturgy hurried as a result of going over time or make others wait outside until the Church becomes available. If you wish to have a longer reflection or more than one Eulogy, please plan on doing them during the Wake at the Funeral Home.

The Funeral Liturgy is a sacred time of reflection and prayer offered for your Loved One. Therefore, the reflection is not an opportunity to share the deceased's exploits or quirks or to tell jokes. It is rather an opportune moment to concentrate on your loved one's faith life and what he or she taught you or others about life, God, the Church, morals, values, etc.

SYMBOLS

Paschal Candle

The Paschal Candle stands at the head of the coffin as a reminder of the Risen Christ who has conquered death and lives among us. This candle also reminds us that our loved ones share in the victory of Jesus over the powers of darkness and now shares the new life offered by Jesus Christ.

Funeral Pall

The Funeral Pall is a reminder of our Baptism into the Christian Community and now of our Baptism into our new life with Christ. We encourage family members to take part in placing the pall on the coffin at the beginning of the Funeral Mass and assist in its removal as the body is about to be removed from the Church.



Holy Water

The sprinkling of Holy Water at the Funeral reminds us not only of our Baptism call but that in death we also share in Christ's Resurrection, and new life.

Incense

Since the body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, incense is used as a sign of respect for the body and of our prayers rising to the throne of God. This is our final farewell as we send our loved one home to God.

FLOWERS

The Parish provides seasonal decorations. However if you choose to bring additional flowers, please make sure that you or the Funeral Director removes the flowers from the church after the ceremony.

TO DO LIST

Please complete the following:

- 1. Contact the Parish Office at (708) 799-5400 to make the arrangements and schedule a meeting with a representative of St. Veronica Parish in order to prepare the Liturgy.
- 2. Complete the Funeral Pre-Planning Questionnaire at the end of this booklet, pages 20-23.
- 3. Select four Songs from page 8.
- 4. Choose two readings (one from the Old Testament and one from the New Testament). See pages 9-15. If you prefer to use other readings, they would have to be approved by the presider. Please give copies to the designated readers and to the Parish Secretary. St. Veronica Parish will provide printed copies in a binder for the Funeral.
- 5. Select a preferred option of the Prayers of the Faithful (Options A, B, C or D). See pages 16-19.
- 6. Designate two people to read the readings, one to read the Prayers of the Faithful, two Gift Bearers to carry the Offertory Gifts of bread and wine, and, if you choose to have a Eulogy, one person to share a 3-minute-long reflection on behalf of the entire family.

READING SELECTION

FIRST READING FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT

1. A reading from the Book of Wisdom

The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them.

we too might live in newness of life.

[For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection.


